BOWLING BALLS - Every bowler must have a bowling ball and shoes for his/her

manufacturer's name, product name and serial number clearly visible at all times for identification purposes.
Bowlers MUST declare if they are delivering the bowling ball without a thumb inserted in the ball.
Balls and drillings must meet all USBC specifications. All bowling balls may be
checked for compliance with USBC Equipment Specifications.
The following bowling balls are prohibited for use. 900 Global Altered Reality, 900
Global Wolverine, Roo Grip UFO Alert, Storm Electrify Solid, Storm Phaze 4, Storm Trend 2.

Balls without a thumb hole must have a scribed or engraved cross-hair lines ("+")
near the center of the palm to indicate the grip orientation. The ball must be delivered each finger and/or thumb.
Holes or indentations for gripping purposes shall not exceed five and shall be limited to one for each finger and one for the thumb, all for the same hand. Any thumb hole
that is not used for gripping purposes during the delivery would be classified as a balance hole.
Individuals who violate the gripping orientation rule are subject to disqualification from the tournament.

EQUIPMENT ALTERATIONS - Altering the surface of a bowling ball by the use of abrasives, cleaners or polish is prohibited during competition. In addition, no permitted to sand the surface of their bowling balls prior to certified competition however, the use of abrasives strictly is prohibited once the first ball is thrown in competition. The outer surface of the bowling ball may only be cleaned with a dry

FOREICN SUBSTANCE - No foreign substance can be applied to bowling shoes or approaches. This includes, but is not limited to: rosin, powder, Easy-Slide, dry bags, side stone, soap stone, polish, wax, alcohol and like products.
